DASA would like to confirm the following in relation to DASA 66 Module 10 Make Up Training.

RMs (or delegates) are to arrange and report briefing and/or self-study completion:

- for military staff holding draft licences – by 01 Aug 18;
- for contractor staff holding draft licences – by 30 Sep 18

Module 10 training can be delivered within an organisation's broader training programs.

The Module 10 Make up training is provisional training for staff to transition from TAREGs to DASRs. As such, there is **NO** need to meet the DASR 66 Appendix II requirements.

Longer term arrangements for delivery of Module 10 (sustainment training) are under consideration by the services. The training requirement will therefore continue to be DASR 66 Module 10 Make Up Training until formally withdrawn.
