



Changes to the application process for a new or amended MAML

This Newsbreak provides advanced notice of pending changes, to the application process, for a new or amended Military Aircraft Maintenance License (MAML).

DASA is replacing its existing Microsoft Excel based MAML tool, used to process MAML applications, with a new tool developed within DASA's Fast Track software.

Unlike the current Excel based MAML tool, the new Fast Track MAML tool will not be accessible to ADF personnel outside of DASA. Applications for new or amended MAMLs will require the completion of a digital DASR Form 19 (an Excel spreadsheet). This will then be submitted, via a template email, to the dasa.dcadusr66@defence.gov.au inbox. A draft version of the digital DASR Form 19 is currently being consulted with ADF DASR 145 Quality Managers.

The extant MAML application process for Defence Industry (sending a DASR Form 19 via email to the dasa.dcadusr66@defence.gov.au inbox) will remain unchanged.

The new Fast Track MAML tool is expected to be operational in Q4 of 2022. A further Newsbreak will be released, two weeks prior to the transition date, to confirm when the new MAML application process will take effect.
