DASR.139 – AERODROMES

1. DASA wishes to advise the release of the Comment Response Document (CRD) relating to feedback to DASR.139 Aerodromes – Notice of Proposed Amendment.
2. On 04 Jul 2019, DASA released *DASR.139 Aerodromes – Notice of Proposed Amendment 02/2019 – Revision 1* (NPA 02/2019); inviting comment and input from the regulated community.
