Notice of Proposed DASR Amendment 2020-028 – Removal of ARO.40 Aircraft Crash Protection

DASA wishes to advise that Notice of Proposed DASR Amendment (NPA) 2020-028 Removal of ARO.40 has been published for external consultation and welcomes responses from the wider Australian Defence Organisation regulated community prior to 03 December 2020. NPA 2020-028 proposes the removal of DASR ARO.40 Aircraft Crash Protection following DASA review of the framework for managing crash protection attributes of Defence aircraft.

DASA requests that Services submit their responses via their respective Environmental Command Operational Airworthiness organisations, and Defence Groups submit their responses via their respective DASR point of contact.
