The Snapshot survey is administered annually to personnel from Air Force, Army Aviation, Fleet Air Arm and Air Domain (Capability Acquisition & Sustainment Group). In recent years, the program has also been expanded to be administered to select Defence aviation industry partners and the Royal New Zealand Air Force.

The Snapshot survey program is managed by the Defence Flight Safety Bureau (DFSB) and is designed to inform and improve senior management and command awareness on a range of factors that may affect the safety and wellbeing of staff. Snapshot has proven to be of genuine value to senior managers and commanders, and continues to be a key sensor in the safety climate and human systems domains. The Snapshot survey will be conducted online over the period 26 April to 15 May 2022.
