Release of Amendments to DASR ORO.65 and ORO.75

DASA advises that, in the 10 Apr 20 DASR release (recently advised via Newsbreak), proposed amendments to DASR ORO.65 *Carriage and Use of Portable Electronic Equipment* and DASR ORO.75 *Use of Aircraft Role Equipment*, were inadvertently excluded from the amendment package.

The proposed amendments clarify the application of the portable electronic equipment and role equipment management and approval frameworks prescribed in the regulations to support a more robust application; however, they do not change the regulatory intent. DASA has classified the proposed changes as 'Minor' and a Notice of Proposed Amendment will therefore not be released.

DASA is currently processing a change to these regulations and expects to release the amendments via an out-of-cycle amendment to the DASR within the next 2-3 weeks. A fact sheet providing additional application guidance for DASR ORO.65 and ORO.75 will be released concurrent with the DASR amendments.
