CESSATION OF DASR 66 TRANSITIONAL REQUIREMENTS

The transition period for DASR 66 will conclude on 01 March 2020. The “Transitional provisions for Exclusion removal” document will also be withdrawn on this date. All DASR 66 Licence applications submitted to DASA prior to 1st March 2020 will be managed under the current agreed transitional provisions and existing approved remediation plans for exclusion removal.

The following guidance is provided in relation to how a Military Aircraft Maintenance Licence (MAML) application, including initial issue and licence updates, will be assessed and/or reviewed by DASA post 01 March 2020.

1. Any DASR 66 MAML application received post 01 March 2020 shall meet the full requirements of the DASR 66, including all applicable Appendices, or relevant DASA approved pathways.
2. All Form 19 applications must include copies of all supporting evidence that form part of that application. DASR 145 Quality Managers are still responsible for validating the applicant’s information prior to submission. Incorrect or incomplete applications will be returned for re-submission.
3. The DASA approved DASR 66 Module 10 course will be released shortly to replace the “DASR 66 Module 10 - Aviation Legislation - Make-up training Presentation”. DASA will continue to accept the approved Module 10 interim learning packages for licence assessments until the release of the new course.
