AMENDMENT TO AIRWORTHINESS DESIGN REQUIREMENTS MANUAL (ADRM)

DASA wishes to advise that a revised version of AAP 7001.054 ADRM has been released.

Significant changes resulting from this amendment are as follows:

Section 5 – Aircraft Support Systems

Amended Chapter 2 - Aeronautical Life Support Equipment - amended introduction and new explanatory information on ALSE certification and application of design requirements, to support the implementation of recent changes to DASR ORO.40.

In addition to the ADRM amendment, a complementary Factsheet *Certification of ALSE* has been released and is available on the DASA web site.
