Release of DASR amendment including new Aviation Fatigue Management regulations

DASA advises that an amendment to the [Defence Aviation Safety Regulation](#) (DASR) has been released. This amendment incorporates one major, 11 minor and 17 editorial changes applicable to Initial Airworthiness, Continuing Airworthiness, Operations Personnel, Air Operations, Standard Rules of the Air, Air Navigation Service Providers and Aviation Safety Management Systems regulations.

The major change incorporated through this amendment introduces **DASR AVFM Aviation Fatigue Management** regulations for operations personnel, with applicability to Military Air Operators and Air Navigation Service Providers.
